Until what seems almost recently, no attempts had been made to publicly discuss the role of Cocktail Robotics as an index for the integration of technological innovations into the human Lebenswelt, or to document the increasing occurrence of radical hedonism in man-machine communication. Roboexotica is an attempt to fill this vacuum. It is the first and, inevitably, the leading festival concerned with cocktail robotics world-wide. A micro mechanical change of paradigm in the age of borderless capital. Alan Turing would doubtless test this out.

THE STUDY: ACTORS, THEMES AND INSTRUMENTS FOR A DIGITAL HUMANISM INITAITIVE IN VIENNA

Starting point:

- Digital Humanism as a broader movement with shared goals and existing structures does not exist in Vienna (and except for a few places nowhere else)
- However, there are many actors and (largely smaller) initiatives that might be understood within the umbrella of Digital Humanism in Vienna

Aim of the study:

- Identify a substantial part of these actors and initiatives
- Out of the many topics and themes that circulate in Vienna
 - Distil a limited number larger themes that are relevant to Vienna
 - Assess their potential for a Digital Humanism initiative

MA 23 - ECONOMY, LABOUR AND STATISTICS



The magistrates department 23 combines economic, labour market and innovation policy issues as well as statistical tasks. It can thus provide a sound basis for decisions on measures to be taken by the City or the State of Vienna and make a contribution to Vienna as a business location.

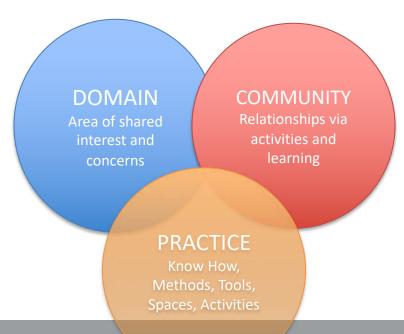
- Interviews (23, with relevant stakeholders) → to collect thematic insights, but also to identify important actors.

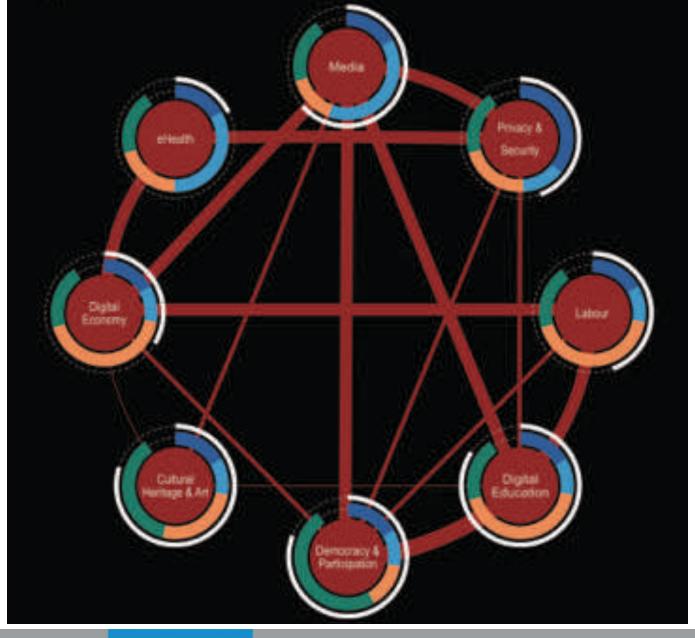


COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE AS AGENTS OF CHANGE



ACTORS AND INITIATIVES AS COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE

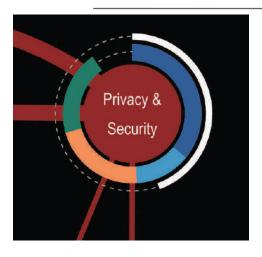
- Many actor fields in Vienna rather "organised" as silos very loose structures (if at all)
- Encounters of actors often not sustainable due to the lack of incentives or scarce funding (for smaller projects, critical security research, open source or data projects ...)
- Actor fields defined as communities of practice (Wenger 1998): communities that are connected by common interests, goals and values → however, empirically the observed actors do not necessarily share all these
- Themes defined deductively communities of practice defined inductively → a Digital Humanism initiative needs to entangle both in a meaningful way



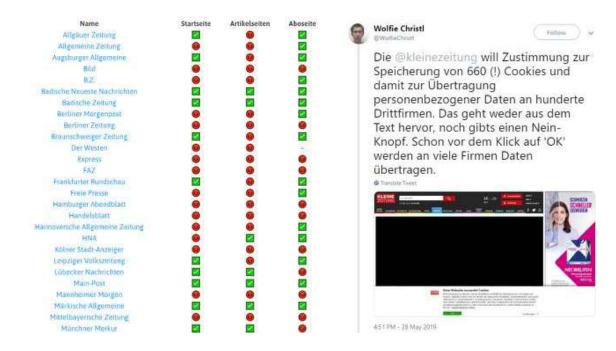
THEMES FOR DIGITAL HUMANISM INITIATIVE



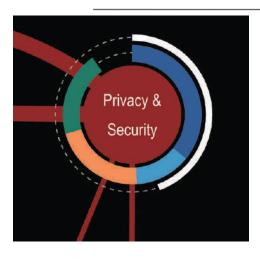
THEME: PRIVACY AND SECURITY



- Huge global issue due to FB, Google et al. with regards to election fraud, data leaks, micro-targeting ...
- GDPR attempt of EU to have a different approach → but in reality, it hasn't changed much



THEME: PRIVACY AND SECURITY

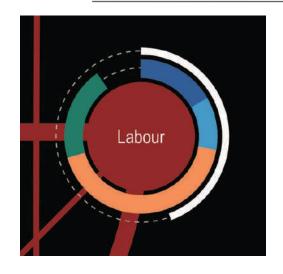


- Strong potential: Vienna has a strong and very well organised community of practice here in particular civil society engagement; hybrids between activism and research
 - NOYB (strong international perspective), epicenter.works, quintessenz, Forum Informationsfreiheit ...
 - European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights
 - Strong research groups around digital/information politics and "security" (AIT, TU Wien, SBA), some critical security studies

Challenges:

- Creating the right instruments to foster collaboration of engagement and research
- Creating contact points and communication channels for digital human rights services
- Making Vienna the international hub for knowledge transfer and exchance

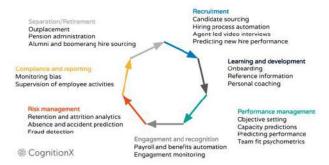
THEME: LABOUR



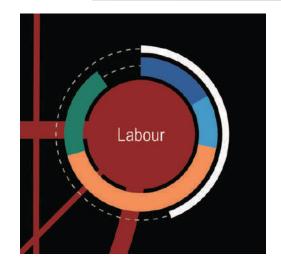
Digitalization is one of the fundamental **challenges** to the working environment

- Requirement of new skills (which also change rapidly)
- Automation via algorithms / Al / robotics → assumption that the skilled work force will be the most affected group
- Gig Economy, Clickworkers
- Employment and HR logics are already dominated by (often biased) imaginations of efficiency and wrong expectations of effect of Artificial intelligence or algorithmic decision systems
- Economies of scale: global players endanger local businesses
- On the other hand, large economic opportunities as well as potential positive overall effects on employment

How is AI being used in HR & Recruitment?



THEME: LABOUR



- Engagement with labour in the digital age is crucial:
 - Scientific research and sharing of non-sensitive data
 - Development of regulation approaches and social security models,
 - Education of future work force and thus being relevant to business
 - Skills development and capacity building

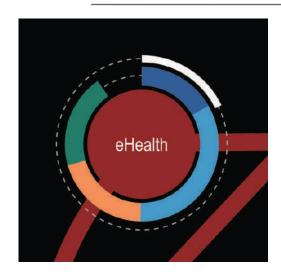
Opportunities:

- Vienna has a strong base in knowledge intensive services
- Vienna has also a strong tradition in workers' right politics and a internationally recognised legal school devoted to these topics
- The Austrian Chamber of Labour with its headquarter in Vienna is investing in Labour 4.0 initiatives.

Challenges:

- Communities of practice rather fragmented
- City as a role model: Constituting expert panels for consultation of City Labour policy

THEME: E-HEALTH



public health needs real data

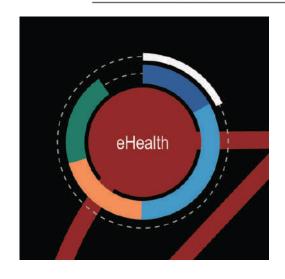
Vienna has a distinct health economy with public authorities as central actors (but increasing importance of the private domain) Digital technologies are increasingly important ...

- Electronic health records and optimisation of public health
- Digital knowledge management systems that support medical or care decision making
- Machine learning in the life sciences to deal with big data but often impartial data: problem of bias, healthcare or healthtech training data not diverse enough, ...
- Telemedicine and ambient assistant living
- Smart technologies and mobile applications (Fitness and Health tracking)
- New types of sharing medical data for research following privacy by design, data clearing models, sandboxes, synthetic data,

THEME: E-HEALTH



Opportunities: Health services are crucial for cities in global competition

- Data as a new resource to improve health care: big data approaches; personalized medicine; bioinformatics and Al → strong research actors in Vienna
- Inclusion of SSH in terms of an interdisciplinary public health approach very weak in Austria
- City of Vienna has a lot of experience in public health and design processes involving multiple

 Evolving health data ecosystem
- Strong patient organisations

Challenges:

stakeholders

- The actor landscape is too vast to monitor
- It will be important to identify promising subthemes and their resp. communities of practice
- Learnings from prior experiences need to be documented and discussed

WHY VIENNA SHOULD FOSTER AND SUPPORT ITS COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE

- A city constantly needs to learn and translate
- **Practice** and **community** is the best grain size at which to describe knowledge in action.

Communities of practice the right frame for planning, co-creation

and engagement

 City planning and social governance rely on community support

 City and communities need to experiment to find the right formats for exchange

WHY VIENNA SHOULD FOSTER AND SUPPORT ITS COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE

To become an internationally recognized place for alternatives to the digital mainstream, the study suggests to strategically focus on 2 aims.

- Vienna needs to become famous with its distinct narrative combining socio-technological innovation with well being.
- Vienna has to recognise that it is already hosting a pool of ideas and people that work on these alternatives; these ideas often exists on the fringe of the system and need to be cultivated as such or even mainstreamed
- → this requires going beyond providing information to network. It also needs resources and sustainable instruments to foster already existing communities of practice as well as enable the emergence of new ones. It will also need dedicated spaces and roles!

HOW SHOULD VIENNA FOSTER ITS COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE

There are many necessary steps, the study concludes with two concrete measures

- 1. Research funding programme "Digital Humanism"
 - To build interdisciplinary research areas where ICT works together with SSH; the knowledge produced should ask very fundamental questions but at the same time be open to application and to transfers of outcomes society and economy
- 2. Curated funding programme
 - To put Vienna on the digital world map by creating new incentives and formats in which innovative research, arts, civil society, public administration and the public can interact on issues of digital humanism

DIGITAL HUMANISM IN VIENNA – FIRST STEPS

Pilot of new funding format at MA7:



The Cultural Department of the City of Vienna has an open project call under the title "Digital Humanism". The call is aimed at scientists in the humanities, social sciences and cultural sciences and information and communication technologies.

Research projects are funded up to a maximum of 40,000 euros each. The total amount of the call is 320,000 euros. The duration of the projects is limited to 12 months. (Deadline for submission August 20, 2019)

Methodological breadth and transdisciplinarity are explicitly desired.

The project projects should preferably involve participants from both scientific fields ("twinning") and/or have a pilot character for possible larger project projects.

Learnings from this pilot will have to be fed into design of 2 new funding programmes: research funding and curated funding programme
